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Economic Integration Framework Implementation

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The *Nested Sovereignty Framework* transforms economic systems by integrating local autonomy with global cooperation, tackling inequality, resource depletion, and cultural diversity. Through community currencies, ethical trade zones, Adaptive Universal Basic Income (AUBI), and global commons governance, it fosters equitable, sustainable prosperity. This index links sixteen sections and provides stakeholders—policymakers, community leaders, NGOs, indigenous groups, and global institutions—with tools like the Economic Integration Seed Kit to implement resilient economies.

Overview

The Nested Sovereignty Framework offers a multi-level architecture for economic integration, aligning local sovereignty with global standards.

It prioritizes inclusivity, resource equity, and interoperability, co-designed with indigenous knowledge for commons management. Aligned with UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth, SDG 10: Reduced Inequalities), it provides tailored pathways for diverse contexts.

Purpose: To create equitable, sustainable economic systems that prevent exploitation, ensure resource justice, and enable cooperation through nested sovereignty and adaptive governance.
