# **Purpose and Overview**

#### **Emergency Cultural Conflict Protocol**

4. Document the conflict and community concerns

# **Community Consultation (1 week):**

- 1. Convene traditional authorities and affected community members
- 2. Apply traditional conflict resolution methods
- 3. Identify culturally appropriate solutions
- 4. Develop modified approaches respecting cultural requirements

## **Resolution Implementation (ongoing):**

- 1. Implement community-approved solutions
- 2. Monitor cultural appropriateness and community satisfaction
- 3. Provide ongoing support for resolution maintenance
- 4. Document lessons learned for future prevention
